Franciscan Saints for May

- 3. <u>Bl. Arthur Bell, Henry Heath, John Woodcock, et al.</u>, priests, martyrs of England, I Ord. There were **Forty Martyrs of England and Wales** comprise a group of Catholic men and women who were executed for treason and related offences in the Kingdom of England between 1535 and 1679. Many were convicted at show trials or even without a trial. All were subjected to the religiously oppressive regimes of the Tudor and Stuart periods. They were canonized on 25 October 1970 by Pope Paul VI.
- 7. <u>Bl. Agnellus of Pisa</u>, religious, I Ord. was an Italian Friar Minor and founder of the Franciscan Order in England.
- 8 <u>Bl. Jeremiah of Valacchia</u>, religious, I Ord.
- 9 St. Catherine of Bologna, virgin, II Ord.
- 10 St. Ivo of Brittany, III Ord.
- 11 St. Ignatius of Laconi, religious, I Ord.
- 11 Bl. Antonio of St. Anne Galvoa, I Ord.
- 12 St. Leopold Mandic, priest, I Ord.
- 16 <u>St. Margaret of Cortona</u>, III Ord. The Magdala of the Franciscans. She was possessed of rare beauty, and before long this became a snare for her. For the space of 9 years she gave herself up to a life of sin and scandal. After the murder of the man with whom she was living, she returned repentant to her native town of Laviano. In a penitential garb, her hair cut short, a cord around her neck, she knelt at the door of the church and publicly asked the entire congregation to forgive the scandal she had given. After 3 years of penitence, she was accepted into the Third Order.
- 17 St. Paschal Baylon, religious, I Ord.
- 18 St. Felix of Cantalice, religious, I Ord.
- 19 St. Crispin of Viterbo, religious, I Ord., and St. Theophilus of Corte, priest, I Ord.
- 20 St. Bernardine of Siena, priest, I Ord.
- 21 <u>Bl. Franz Jägerstätter</u>, Martyr, III Ord. when repeatedly called up for military service, he declared himself bound to refuse by conscience and because of the commandment of the love for God and one's neighbor, for "we must obey God rather than people". Condemned to death in 1943 for undermining military discipline, he was beheaded
- 24 Dedication of the Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi
- 28 <u>St. Mariana of Jesus de</u> Paredes, virgin, III Ord. She received the habit of the Third Order from the Franciscans in her native town of Quito, Ecuador, and in consideration of her great virtue, she was permitted to take the three vows of religion. Then she repaired to her home where she led a life hidden in God and devoted to prayer and penance.
- 30 <u>St. Ferdinand, king</u>, III Ord. King of Leon and Castile, was buried in the great cathedral of Seville before the image of the Blessed Virgin, clothed, at his own request, in the habit of the Third Order of St. Francis. His body remains incorrupt. Many miracles took place at his tomb, and Clement X canonized him in 1671.




<u>Prayer for the</u> Intercession of St. Padre Pio of Pietrelcina

Telegram from the Pope

The Vatican sent a telegram to Boston Cardinal Sean O'Malley, in which Pope Francis expresses sympathy for the victims of the marathon bombings and urges Americans to "combat evil with good."

Here's the <u>full text</u> of the telegram, as provided by the Vatican:

His Eminence Cardinal Sean O'Malley Archbishop of Boston

Deeply grieved by news of the loss of life and grave injuries caused by the act of violence perpetrated last evening in Boston, His Holiness Pope Francis wishes me to assure you of his sympathy and closeness in prayer. In the aftermath of this senseless tragedy,

His Holiness invokes God's peace upon the dead, his consolation upon the suffering and his strength upon all those engaged in the continuing work of relief and response.

At this time of mourning the Holy Father prays that all Bostonians will be united in a resolve not to be overcome by evil, but to combat evil with good (cf. Rom 12:21), working together to build an ever more just, free and secure society for generations yet to come.

Cardinal Dolan of N.Y. said: the deaths and injuries of people in Boston calls on all of us to pray for the souls of Those Killed the healing Of Those injured and the restoration of peace for all of us unsettled by the bombings at a world renowned sporting event.

Let us continue to pray for the victims of the Boston Marathon Bombing. Our secular patron saint against jihad is St. Ferdinand III, King of Spain.
