SIX PREPARING FOR ADMISSION

On May 22 we have six inquirers who will possibly be admitted to the Fraternity. They have read and written reflections on a biography of St. Francis; they have answered reflection questions required by the Region; and they have held a private retreat to discern their vocation. These items were discussed with their formators. A simple admission rite is conducted in the presence of the fraternity and usually a friar. The ceremony begins with a hymn, an admonition of dedication to the Franciscan way, a prayer and readings from the Bible and the writings of St. Francis. The inquirer or inquirers then formally request admission into the fraternity as candidates, are accepted by the fraternity minister and are confirmed as members by the friar, if present. The minister then reads the order's creed and offers the fraternity's commitment to supporting the new members. The rite ends with the sign of peace, a hymn and the Blessing of St. Francis.
