These are the things for which we petition. Grant them for the honor of thy holy name, to which, with the Father and the Holy Ghost, be all honor and glory, thanksgiving, renown, and lordship forever and ever. Amen.

Friendship and Fraternity:

St. John wrote that God is love. "God is friendship," echoed St. Aelred. Like holiness, friendship is best understood when it is incarnated. One of the richest friendships in history is that of Francis and Clare of Assisi. They had only one meal they were to share together. They seldom saw one another. Yet their bond of friendship made them spiritual twins.

Through Francis' example, Clare had renounced her wealth years before and embraced strict poverty. Through the years when Francis had doubts about his own path, he turned to Clare. After Francis' death, Clare was instrumental in preserving the purity of the ideals she shared with Francis. More than 800 years later, the First, Second and Third Orders continue to exemplify those Franciscan ideals.

What is the Transitus?

A devotion familiar to all Franciscans which has survived the test of the last three decades is the Transitus. Each year on the third evening of October, we ritually remember the passing of Francis of Assisi from this life into God. In fact, the Transitus has become a significant and even a necessary annual event. To ritually revisit the story of Francis' passing is vital; without it something significant is missing. It specifies the living memory of Francis; it intensifies our commitment to follow Christ in the way of the poor man of Assisi.

"Be praised, my Lord, through our sister Bodily Death, from whose embrace no living person can escape.

Woe to those who die in mortal sin!

Happy those she finds doing Your most holy will.

The second death can do no harm to them.

Praise and bless my Lord, and give thanks, and serve Him with great humility."

When the Swallows Come Back to Capistrano

Cliff swallows winter each year in Argentina and then fly back to The Mission of San Juan Capistrano each March. They make their nests in the eaves there until October when their migration cycle starts again. People from all over the world are known to visit, especially on the March 19 feast day of St. Joseph when these small birds return at dawn to settle back into their mud nests at the ruins of the Great Stone Church. Damaged by the earthquake of 1812, this Franciscan church is now famous for housing these birds. On the feast of San Juan Capistrano, Oct. 23, the small birds are known to take flight again for their winter destination.
