Congregation for Social Justice (CSJ)





On July 7, 2015 four members of Padre Pio Fraternity joined more than 200 people affiliated with the Congregation for Social Justice, CSJ at the Raleigh City Council meeting to address the lack of affordable housing in Raleigh. Those there wore White Shirts, a tradition dating back to April 1, 2008 when the CSJ came before the City Council addressing concerns for the lack of affordable housing.

In August of 2006, CSJ was formed and would focus on advocacy rather than service; the faith-based nature of the group would be highlighted; the focus would be on Raleigh, though it was acknowledged that issues on the county and state level were likely

to be addressed; and that attendees at the monthly meeting were representing their congregations/organizations and not just acting as individuals.

The CSJ Missions Statement; "Congregations for Social Justice is a coalition of Raleigh faith communities committed to advocating for public policies that create a better Raleigh for all people; working for social justice in solidarity with our most vulnerable neighbors; and building a sustainable, diverse network of relationships across our faith communities and with other partners."

With a specific agenda of; advocating for better affordable housing policies and better community corrections policies for those leaving the prison system and searching for employment and housing. CSJ continues to meet monthly and address the issues of housing, and corrections policies.

11. St. John XIII, pope, III Ord. Pope John was captivated by the Franciscan Order and charism. He once exclaimed: "What a mystery! What a mystery this Franciscanism!" Pope John explained the origin of his vocation as a Secular Franciscan1 "When he was still very young, I would see the humble and modest friars who edified me very much passing nearby my house. They often invited me to the Franciscan friary of Baccanello to pray in solitude and recollection." While a young adolescent, he was received as a Secular Franciscan . The guardian of Baccanello said: "He (Angelo Roncalli) once reminded me that I am a poor cardinal before being your protector; but also I enjoy the heartfelt sentiments of a humble and faithful Secular Franciscan." He wrote to the guardian of the friary of Baccanello in 1956: "Fraternizing with the sons of St. Francis accompanies and sweetens my spirit for the whole year." During a visit as pope to Bellegra friary in the Franciscan province of Rome on 25 August 1959, he told the friars: "At one time I thought of following the humble friars of Baccanello, but then a stronger wind blew me on to another road." And on departure from Bellegra friary, he said: "Too bad that I must go! When I am here with my brothers, I do not think of time constrictions."


