Holy Father's Intentions for September

O most holy Virgin, Mother of our Lord Jesus Christ: by the overwhelming grief you experienced when you witnessed the martyrdom, the crucifixion, and death of your divine Son, look upon us with eyes of compassion, and awaken in our hearts a tender sympathy for those suffering, particularly the poor and the marginalized. Amen.

The month of September is dedicated to the Seven Sorrows of Mary. Devotion to the sorrows of the Virgin Mary dates from the twelfth century, when it made its appearance in monastic circles under the influence of St. Anselm and St. Bernard. The Cistercians and then the Servites undertook to propagate it. It became widespread in the fourteenth and especially the fifteenth centuries, particularly in the Rhineland and Flanders, where Confraternities of the Sorrowful Mother sprang up.

Justice and Peace Exchange a Kiss By Brother Luciano Lotti, OFM Cap.

When Padre Pio considered the question of justice he went straight to the heart of the problem. The question cannot be reduced to the simple claim of one's rights that have been infringed. He said, it is necessary to begin by recognizing that justice is a personal question; we must be the first person to practice it before we can ask of it from another person. This concern for justice would guide Padre Pio's understanding of all the other virtues. His main concern was toward his neighbor and he would be very firm about the rights of those who were least able to defend themselves.

He demonstrated this concern toward his employees. Fatter Michele who was the bursar of the San Giovanni Rotondo friary, recalled how Padre Pio himself would ensure that the medical and pension contributions were being paid regularly into the salaries of the personnel of the friary and his hospital of the Home for Relief and Suffering.

As for defending and standing up for one's own rights, it would be wrong to think of Padre Pio as being weak-willed or that he encouraged one to be submissive before the wrongs against one. He stood up and defended the friars and even himself on several occasions when it was a question of the person's dignity or the truth that was being affronted. That said though, in claiming one's rights and justice, he desired that one bear in mind Our Lord's example of justice and mercy.

In his letter to Raffaelina Cesare in 1915, about an unpleasant state of affairs in her family because of a nephew's misadministration of a property shared with her brother. She asked the Padre what she should do. Padre Pio who did not hesitate to give advice answered the letter very clearly.

In financial matters, one must not give in to emotions, one must be ready to yield and at the same time be clear so as to avoid future problems. It is necessary to unite justice and charity so that justice and peace exchange a kiss, to use the phrase of Padre Pio reminding us again the promise of the Psalmist, "See where mercy and faithfulness meet in unity; how justice and peace are united in one embrace!" *From the Voice of Padre Pio June 2015*
