
### **Ongoing Formation**

Our meeting on June 27 featured a presentation and discussion of Martin Luther King's *Letters from Birmingham Jail*, penned during King's eight days in jail as a response to eight clergymen who had urged him to abandon a boycott which he'd led in 1963.

Sharon Winzeler, OFS, Joan Monti, OFS, and Anna Rzewnicki, OFS, gifted us with a presentation explaining the background and circumstances leading up to the Birmingham boycott. This included Dr. King's own inspirations in civil disobedience, a historical background of the Montgomery Bus boycott some years earlier which was sparked by the arrest of Rosa Parks, as well as several of the largely unsung heroes in the movement to end segregation in the South.

Segregation's legal end came about in the 1960's, largely in thanks to the efforts of Dr. King, who fell victim to an assassin's bullet in 1968. But how far have we moved in the quest for equality and justice in those years since? As Franciscans, what role do we have in this quest?

These are questions we continue to ask ourselves today.
