Ongoing Formation –

In our August meeting David Shick, OFS, and Michael Hancock, OFS, gifted all of us with a first-class presentation in our continuing study of the book *To Live As Francis Lived*. This presentation on chapters 12-15, and 18, reflected on the topics of conversion, penance, reconciliation, poverty, and humility.

We were reminded, as we often need to be reminded, that conversion is a *total* turning to God, a process which is lived out each and every day. Profound gratitude, and the recognition of our own shortcomings, are the two sides of conversion.

St. Francis recognized that sin often attacks us through bodily senses. Every sin (which happens when we are less "good" than we were created to be...meaning often) separates us from God, and has social ramifications. We will never be perfect in this life, but penance and reconciliation, help us to get better, to think about God and others (rather than just ourselves) more, and inch us toward being those beautiful people created in the image of God.

The life of St. Francis is a reminder that humility (the attitude of "we are nothing without God") is the twin of Christ's poverty ("we want nothing but God"), which help us lead lives of penance and reconciliation, that we can go on in our ongoing daily, and total, conversion.

Items of Interest:


