Ilia Delio, OFS, uses the term "Christo-genesis" to describe this movement.

Our brother David Shick, OFS, gave us an excellent talk about the ramifications and relevance of Christo-genesis in our modern world, as brought up in Chapter 7 of Ilia Delio's *the Humility of God*. The proliferation of technology, travel, and international commerce has done much to make most all of us, all around the world, far more aware of our interdependence. Our world is more akin to a "global village" than ever before.



As Christians living in the world today, we are the catalysis of the living force behind this movement of all people toward unity in Christ, and therefore called to participate in Christogenesis. That's quite a responsibility we have!

To do this we must be *Christic* Christians, meaning Christ-centered, with a Christ-like love that bends down to embrace everyone, no matter what. The Holy Trinity is our model for this, a completely self-emptying love in which all is given to the other.

On the flip side, Delio defines sin as the failure to love, an "erasure of Christ" in the world.

"It is the task of Christians to help personalize the universe in the love of Christ," Delion wrote. "We are called to...Christify the universe by our actions of love...This is the distinct Christian vocation, to discover Christ at the heart of the universe in all people..."

So remember to be that shining example!
