Secular Franciscan Order (OFS)

Overview of Initial and Ongoing Formation Process

The Secular Franciscan formation process is a continuum, that is, each stage flows into the next. Aspects that are essential in the first phase, <u>Orientation</u>, will be essential to the second phase, <u>Inquiry</u>, the third phase, <u>Candidacy</u>, and into lifelong <u>Ongoing</u> formation of professed members.

OFS formation is not a group class or course in which one "graduates" from one phase to another. Rather, it is a personal journey into Franciscan spirituality, Catholic teachings, and the OFS gospel way of life exemplified by St. Francis and St. Clare. The process focuses on being FORMED into the likeness of Christ. It is a time of communal discernment between those discerning a vocation to the Secular Franciscan Order, the Fraternity and the Holy Spirit.

ORIENTATION. (6 months)

The Orientation phase of formation is critical. Formation resources used during Orientation provide ample time for dialogue and sharing since this is the ideal time to discern a Secular Franciscan vocation. The time frame is six months. Content for the Orientation Phase includes:

- 1. An understanding of discernment and vocation
- 2. Brief review of Catholic doctrine and Christian morals
- 3. The Rule of Life and brief history of the Secular Franciscan Order
- 4. An explanation of Franciscan prayer life and apostolic activity
- 5. Phases of Secular Franciscan formation and expectations
- 6. Study of the lives of St. Francis and St. Clare
- 7. Branches of the Franciscan family
- 8. Understanding of Franciscan symbols
- 9. Franciscan prayer experience, including the Liturgy of the Hours and Franciscan Crown

INQUIRY (12 months)

The Inquiry phase, as the first formal period of initiation, is a time of discernment and choice of the Franciscan life. During this time, the Inquirer participates in the life of the Fraternity and comes to understand the OFS way of life. At the same time, the Fraternity comes to know the Inquirer better, so that it can discern how best to respond to the Inquirer's request to become part of the Fraternity.

The Inquiry Phase begins with *The Ceremony of Introduction and Welcoming*. This is ritual or service that promises the support of the Fraternity on the journey that the Inquirer is about to undertake. During this phase, which is twelve months, the Inquirer, assisted by the Formation Team, seeks to determine honest responses to these basic questions:

- What is a vocation, and how am I called?
- What is Gospel life, and how am I called to live it?
- What is a vocation to the Secular Franciscan Order, and am I called to live that way of life?

Content for the Inquiry phase includes:

- 1. A deeper understanding of discernment and vocation specifically to the OFS
- 2. In-depth study of the lives of St. Francis and St. Clare
- 3. First-hand exposure to the writings of St. Francis and St. Clare
- 4. In-depth study of OFS history, including the evolution of its Rules of Life
- 5. Overview of the organizational structure of the Secular Franciscan Order
- 6. Introduction to the Rule of Life, General Constitutions, Statutes of the OFS, and the OFS Ritual
- 7. Understanding of how Sacred Scripture impacts the life of the Secular Franciscan

- 8. The Catholic Church in light of the Second Vatican Council (especially the documents, *Lumen Gentium* and *Gaudium et Spes*)
- 9. An understanding of the spirituality which is both secular and (for most aspirants) lay: the family, the dignity of work, ecology, and social justice and political involvement

CANDIDACY (12 months)

During Candidacy, considered the most important stage in the initial formation process, focus is on the *Secular Franciscan Rule* which supplies the path, the approach, and the guide. Therefore, considerable emphasis is placed on reading, understanding, digesting and incarnating the *Rule*. The living out of the *Rule* is crucial in preparing for Permanent Profession since it provides the structure for growing in the spirit of penance and ongoing conversion within the context of the Franciscan Fraternity.

Candidacy begins with the Rite of Admission into the OFS, the public acceptance by the Order of the Candidate's request and intention to live the gospel life in the manner of St. Francis as contained in the *OFS Rule* which has been approved by the Catholic Church.

During Candidacy, the entire Fraternity participates in and nurtures the growth and development of the Candidate's evangelical living of the *OFS Rule*. It is important that the Candidate be given opportunities to experience, interiorize, integrate and live out the gospel values presented in the *OFS Rule*. The time frame is an extended period lasting 18 to 24 months. The Candidacy phase concludes with the Rite of Profession (Permanent Commitment) into the Secular Franciscan Order.

Content for the Candidacy Phase includes:

- 1. In-depth study of the prologue to the *OFS Rule* (*Volterra Letter*)
- 2. Thorough study of the *OFS Rule* (revised in 1978)
- 3. Sacred Scripture and the opportunity to experience, interiorize and integrate gospel values
- 4. Franciscan spirituality and apostolic life
- 5. Detailed study of the OFS Constitutions and SFO Statutes
- 6. Lives of the Secular Franciscan saints and other Franciscans
- 7. Writings of Francis, Clare, Bonaventure and Franciscan scholars
- 8. Franciscan sources, including traditions, stories and the purpose for medieval legends
- 9. The *OFS Ritual*, especially the Rite of Profession
- 10. Continued Franciscan prayer experiences, prayer forms and a retreat

ONGOING FORMATION:

The purpose of Ongoing Formation is to support the professed members' commitment and to strengthen their Franciscan vocation of lifelong daily conversion. Those who are engaged in Initial Formation (Inquiry and Candidacy) are expected to participate in monthly fraternity gatherings and ongoing formation.

As stated in the Secular Franciscan General Constitutions (Article 44.1): "Begun by the preceding stages, the formation of the brothers and sisters takes place in a permanent and continuous way. It should be understood as an aid in the conversion of each and everyone and in the fulfillment of their proper mission in the Church and in society."

- 1. Ongoing Formation is a process of renewal for the entire fraternity by which we are encouraged and challenged to live our vocation in the actual situations and contingencies of daily living.
- 2. Ongoing Formation is the outgrowth of proper Initial Formation, realizing that we are in a continual process of conversion and growth all the days of our life.
- 3. Ongoing Formation necessarily includes additional information and updating in various areas of spirituality, apostolic life, and deepening of our commitment to the Gospel life. None of us ever completes formation. Rather, it is a lifelong process.
- 4. Other opportunities for Ongoing Formation include:
 - a. Retreats
 - b. Days of renewal and special observances
 - c. Community celebrations

- d. Interaction between OFS fraternities
- e. Interaction with the Friars, the Poor Clares and the Third Order Religious
- f. Attendance at Regional and National gatherings
- g. Workshops and other formation gatherings

Content for Ongoing Formation may include:

- 1. The Prologue to the Rule (Volterra Letter)
- 2. A detailed study of the OFS Rule of Life, General Constitutions, Statues, Ritual and Regional Guidelines
- 3. Writing of Francis, Clare, Bonaventure, Duns Scotus and other Franciscan scholars and theologians
- 4. Franciscan Spirituality and History
- 5. Articles from the TAU-USA and the COMMUNIO
- 6. Papal Encyclicals, Apostolic letters and statements
- 7. Pastoral Statements from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB)
- 8. Official documents and statements of the Franciscan Family (International, National, Regional, Local)
- 9. Other Franciscan prayer experiences (e.g., Transitus, Masses for Feast Days, Office of the Passion, Contemplative Prayer as practiced by St. Clare of Assisi
- 10. Learning about and being involved in Justice, Peace, and the Integrity of Creation group apostolates
