Discussion Questions

1. The Secular Franciscan Rule 5 asks us to "seek to encounter the living and active person of Christ in their brothers and sisters, in Sacred Scripture, in the Church, and in liturgical activity."

Share ways you are personally aware of God's kindness and presence in your life.

- 2. The Secular Franciscan Rule 19 states, "Mindful that they are bearers of peace which must be built up unceasingly, they should seek out ways of unity and fraternal harmony through dialogue, trusting in the divine seed in everyone and in the transforming power of love and pardon. Messengers of perfect joy in every circumstance, they should strive to bring joy and hope to others."
- 3. The Secular Franciscan Rule 10 states, "United themselves to the redemptive obedience of Jesus, who placed his will in the Father's hands, let them faithfully fulfill the duties proper to their various life circumstances. Let them follow the poor and crucified Christ, witness to him even in difficulties and persecutions."

Brother Lawrence did not complain. He faithfully fulfilled the duties he was given. He was a "bearer of peace" and was a "witness" to the "crucified Christ."

7. Liturgy of the Hours: Led by Char Witosky

According to the OFS Rule (art. 8), the members of the Secular Franciscan Order are to join in liturgical prayer in one of the forms proposed by the Church, reliving the mysteries of Christ.

These prayers may be:

- a) Morning and evening prayer from The Liturgy of the Hours, either in common or in private. These celebrations are to be preferred at the fraternity meeting.
- b) A shortened form of The Liturgy of the Hours adapted to the local Churches.
- c) The Little Office of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
- d) The Office of the Passion written by St. Francis of Assisi.
- e) The office of the twelve Our Fathers in one of its many versions that have been enriched with short biblical readings and also adapted to the structure of The Liturgy of the Hours, especially since this form of prayer still thrives in many parts of the world and is a useful way of praying in everyday circumstances.
